The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill is committed to equality of educational opportunity. Consistent with this principle and Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, it is the University's policy not to discriminate in offering access to its educational programs and activities on the basis of gender, sexual orientation, gender identity or gender expression. Sexual or gender-based harassment, sexual assault or sexual violence and sexual exploitation are forms of prohibited discrimination and harassment that are based on sex or gender. The University also prohibits related misconduct including interpersonal (relationship) violence and stalking.

The University encourages everyone to report incidents and seek support as needed. You may choose to pursue some or all of the below options at any time. Please note that the University can assist students with making a police report or with other legal processes if requested.

## ***How do I file a report?***

- **Report to Law Enforcement**
  - Report criminal activity to the Department of Public Safety (DPS) (on campus) or local police in order to pursue criminal charges and obtain protection.
- **Report Anonymously to the University**
  - Report anonymously through the Dean of Students website or the “Silent Witness” form on the DPS website.
- **Report Formally to the University**
  - Report formally through the Student Complaint/Deputy Title IX Coordinator at (919) 843-3878 (see below for information about interim protective measures).
- **Pursue Civil Legal Action**
  - Obtain a civil no-contact order or other remedies and protective measures through the court system.

## ***How do I seek support?***

- **Confidential Psychological/Emotional Support**
  - Support provided on campus for all identities through the Gender Violence Services Coordinator\* at (919) 962-1343, Counseling & Psychological Services (CAPS), Campus Health Services, Women’s Health Clinic and the University Ombuds Office\*. Support may also be provided off campus by the Orange County Rape Crisis Center or the Compass Center for Women and Families.
- **Confidential Medical Support**
  - The Emergency Room at UNC Hospitals or Campus Health Services can complete a forensic exam, collect evidence and test for and treat sexually transmitted infections. Emergency contraception can be obtained from a pharmacist without a prescription or medical examination. \*\*If a survivor is unsure about filing a report, they should still consider preserving the evidence (i.e., evidence collection, forensic exam and documenting the event) as soon as possible after an incident. Evidence may be used later to support a report. Forensic exams can be obtained at the Emergency Room at UNC Hospitals or at Campus Health Services up to 5 days after an assault.\*\*
- **Interim Protective Measures**
  - Measures may include campus based no-contact orders, academic accommodations, housing accommodations and changes to employment situations. Contact the Student Complaint/Deputy Title IX Coordinator at (919) 843-3878 or the Office of Human Resources to obtain information about interim protective measures.
